"I really didn't mean to hurt anyone, it was an accident." I have not heard anyone have to say that, thank goodness, but with increasing evidence of bullet holes in the ceiling plates in the indoor range, impact marks on the walls of the indoor range and my own observations it is time for a reminder of some basic gun safety.

• All guns should be unloaded when brought onto the range. The



only exception would be if you have a CHL and you are carrying concealed. REMEMBER the key word is CONCEALED. Keep it concealed and do not practice drawing your concealed handgun when it is loaded.

- Never load your firearm until you are on the line, the line is hot, and the muzzle is pointing down range.
- When carrying your firearm to or from the line it must be unloaded. action open (or in a gun case) and muzzle pointing up. Never, never, never sweep or point your muzzle at other folks, I don't care if you are positive the gun is unloaded, just don't do it.
- When on the firing line always be aware of where the muzzle is pointing. When loading, adjusting sights, clearing a malfunction or talking to the shooter next to you always know where the muzzle of your gun is pointing and that should be down range.
- Only shoot as fast as you can control the firearm and hit the intended target. Spray and pray should not

be a term we use to describe our shooting style at our gun club. Only shoot at a rate of fire where you can keep ALL rounds on the intended and appropriate target. If your rapid fires results in impacts on the ceiling baffles or into the target frames then you are shooting too fast so SLOW IT DOWN.

All of us (me included), regardless of experience or how long you have been around guns are subject to distraction or forgetfulness so remember, don't be sorry, be safe. SAFETY FIRST ... ALWAYS!

- Please stay on the roads. Do not drive on the grassy areas as vehicles tear up the grass and leave ruts in the ground that make life rough for those mowing the grass.
- On long range Thursday, if you are the last one to leave, please take the Long Range Shooting In Progress sign down. Folks like me will believe you are still out there shooting when vou are not.
- Save us a buck and turn off the lights when you leave the indoor range, club house, restrooms and such.
- Save us 2 bucks and turn off the ventilation fan when done in the indoor range.

Ladies Pistol Class A Huge Success

What started out as a spontaneous one time group of ladies wanting to learn gun safety and how to shoot has turned into one of our clubs most successful programs. Starting out with 10 ladies, member provided handguns and member fronted ammunition we now offer 4 classes a year, have 3 certified NRA instructors, received an NRA grant to buy pistols and have many coaches who volunteer their time to help and make sure everyone is safe. This has grown well beyond any expectations and continues to grow faster than we can accommodate and mostly by word of mouth. Started by John Weil, he is now assisted by NRA instructors Sheri McAlister and Mark Edwards with several members and even class graduates acting as coaches. By mid February all classes for 2011 were full and we have a waiting list just incase someone cancels. It is amazing the response we are getting and the interest ladies have in learning about firearms. We get all ages and skill levels from, "I don't like guns but my husband has them in the house and I want to feel safe around them" to "I have always wanted to learn how to shoot but did not know where to start". We even had one lady who after having been shot in the shoulder at a young age spent the rest of her life up to now being afraid of firearms. She attended our class and after an emotional first pull of the trigger she has become and excellent shot, exuberantly attended a gun show, purchased her first handgun and is anxious to learn more and get involved in the shooting sports. We have seen success story after success story and some of these ladies have become members of DRRC.

This is a six week course, one evening a week for 3 hours each evening. We cover the full NRA Basic Pistol class plus more with plenty of opportunity for hands-on shooting. The first week is classroom instruction only with the next 4 weeks a combination of classroom and shooting .22 caliber pistols only. Week six instructors and coaches bring in their big guns and give the ladies an opportunity to try out 9mm - .45 ACP handguns. Shooting handguns larger than .22 caliber is strictly voluntary but few have turned down the opportunity. This class is free to ladies except for the cost of ammunition. And sorry guys, this is a ladies only class; spouses or significant others may not participate or help with instruction.

Any ladies even remotely interested in this class should sign up now as you most likely will not get into a class at the last moment. We want the ladies to be safe, learn about handguns, and


