Budget figures will be finalized during the month of April and are scheduled for presentation to the membership at the May 3 membership meeting. After that meeting the budget will then go to the Board for approval at their May 31st meeting. Upon Board approval the budget will then be presented to the membership at the June 7 membership meeting for adoption for the 2012-13 fiscal year.

Black Powder Cartridge Rifle (BPCR)

Our new discipline Black Powder Cartridge Rifle shooting had our first competitive shoot in February. Although we experienced a minimal turnout, those of us who were present and shot the match had a good time in spite of all the weather could throw at us. We shot at 300, 600 and 800 yards. Scores were less than stellar on account of the weather (that's my story and I'm sticking to it) but we have now established "record high score" for the match and invite all to come out and try to better our scores. Dave Kendall took top honors with Jim Kendall two points behind for second place. So consider the gauntlet as having been thrown down to all comers. Our next scheduled match will be in October but in the meantime BPCR has the exclusive use of long range on the afternoon of the second Tuesday of each month right after our regular Tuesday maintenance.

We usually start shooting for practice at about one o'clock and shoot for the rest of the day. We would like to start some informal competitions on these second Tuesdays where we pick a distance between 300 and 800 or even 1,000 yards and shoot for smallest group. We have awards to give for smallest group so come out and test your skill. Bear in mind that all honest BPCR shooters consider anything closer than 300 yards as knife fighting range and beneath the dignity of a real shooter.

On another note, we have a number of club members who have been attending the Quigley BPCR match in Forsythe, Montana over Father's Day weekend for the past few years and would like to extend an invitation to other shooters to come and join us this year.
