
Service Rifle Class & Match

The May 18th class will be from 6 pm to 10 pm with the match on May 19th going from 9 am to about 2 pm - 3 pm. This match will be from the 100 yard covered firing line on reduced targets to simulate shooting across the course.

Those of you that have shot in a least one match and have attended one class know what is going on and you are now part of the coaching group for the newest shooters please help all that you can.

If you do not have a high power classification card or are new to this discipline then you must attend the class and be preregistered. The match and class or just the match fee is \$10, club supplied ammunition and rifle are \$35 for 58 rounds of 30-06 payable the night of the class. However, you may bring your own rifle and if it is 30-06 you can buy club



ammunition to use at this match. Make sure that your rifle has the ability to have a sling attached to the front of the hand guard and the butt stock. It can be a web or leather sling, web slings are easier for a new shooter to use.

If you have a high power classification card or have attended this class before and just want to get in some practice you can show up on Saturday but there has been a lot of interest in this match and the last few have been almost full. Registration is from 8 am to 8:30 am, shooting will start as soon as we are set up after 9 am.

All people must wear eye protection. They do not have to be safety glasses. Sunglasses or regular eyeglasses are acceptable. Hearing protection is required.

If you have never attended one of these events you should find the time to come out and give it a try, this would be a good place to bring a junior out and see if they have any interest in high power shooting. We have AR15's for them to use. Ladies this is a good place for you to start to learn shooting high power and you can use our AR15's as well. You will have fun and learn something.

This is the event you need to complete in order to be able to order a M1-Garand from the CMP.

1. Click on the service rifle program discipline
2. Find the class/match schedule, find the class you wish to sign up for.
3. Click on the (click here) words.
4. Fill out the form and submit it.

The Annual Work Day this year is Saturday, April 21st. This is the last chance for those needing work hours for the 2018 Membership Renewal. We do not credit late work, we do not pro-rate hours (anything less than 8 hours counts as zero) and you cannot give hours to another member. But your Associate and Junior work hours apply towards your 8-hour total.

The range is closed all day to shooting activities. Work starts at 8am, please arrive early to sign in. The sign in area is in the Clubhouse. In the past, there has been a procedure and a way to post work hour slips. This year Project Coordinator Ron Carey may choose to use a work hours sheet instead. Whatever is used for record keeping, make sure you log out at the end of the day and make sure your hours are turned in. It is your responsibility to insure this is done to get your work hours credit.

Ron will have plenty of projects to complete. You will be assigned to various tasks with a crew leader. At mid-day lunch will be provided. After lunch it's back to finishing up the projects. These include the kinds of landscaping maintenance you do around the house, as well as cleaning up range areas, repairing targets, light carpentry, painting and so on.

If you have any major resources to offer that day, let Ron know prior to Work Day. Equipment like a dump truck, farm tractor with mower, riding mower, chipper or small track hoe would be helpful. Small power tools like brush cutters, string trimmers, chain saws and other hand tools like carpentry and landscape tools are also suggested to bring with you. Don't forget gloves, work boots, a hat and rain gear.

Members who joined the Club before July 1, 2017 and have not attained Old Time Status are required to contribute 8 hours of work for the year or pay the \$150 Work Hour Assessment on their upcoming renewal. Any work performed after this work day will count for next year's total.

Members who joined after July 1, 2017 are already credited with 8 work hours for the upcoming membership renewal but your help is welcome, as it is for Old Time Members and Senior Members who have already completed their hours.

Initiative 42

Initiative 42 is in the works and will have very serious consequences for all Oregonians that believe in the 2nd amendment if it passes. I am not going to try and explain the initiative to you. You can read it online. They need 88,000 signatures to get it on the ballot.

In my reading of this initiative I understand some of the basics to mean that you would not be able to purchase any firearm or magazine as defined. It also means that anyone who already owns a firearm or magazine as defined will need to:

- A. Remove it from the state.
- B. Sell it only to an authorized FFL.
- C. Render it permanently inoperable.
- D. Turn it into the state for destruction. *OR*
- E. Register it, if qualified, with the state police and pay any fees to be determined.

Here as some examples of an assault weapon as defined by the initiative.

- A. Almost every AR style rifle.

- E. Any centerfire rifle that is less than 30 inches long.
- F. And of course all magazines with a capacity of more than 10 rounds.

As you think about this and think you just might sell off your "assault weapons" I can't imagine many dealers in Oregon are going to want to buy them if they can't resell them without going out of state. Or you will get pennies on

the dollar. Just a thought.


