Shooting Steel

Discipline Directors and other shooters who shoot at steel targets: pay attention to the condition of the steel and replace when it gets pitted. The pitting greatly increases the possibility of ricochets and bounce-back. In June a shooter was hit by a bullet fragment bouncing back from a steel target fifteen yards away. He got a welt on his midsection. Don't forget to wear safety glasses! Also you may shoot at steel only at the Silhouette Range with the exception of the installed swingers and clangers at the 100/200 Yard range.

Sporting Clay Shooting is designed to provide targets that simulate what the shooter may encounter when bird hunting. Each shooting station presents a different pattern of targets.

Three times a year DRRC hosts a National Sporting Clay Association (NSCA) Registered Shoot that attracts some of the best shooters from Oregon and Washington. Open to all NSCA members and non members alike. Every shooter will compete for cash prizes and door prizes will also be awarded.

On August 13th we are hosting our first shoot of the season. The Jeff Tunem Memorial Shoot, in memory of Jeff Tunem (former Shotgun Director) who passed away last year. This is a two-stage shoot and shooters can participate in either one or both events.

100 Bird Sporting Clay event \$50 with \$10 back to class as prize money.

50 Bird 5 stand for \$25 with \$10 back to class as prize money. Hunters Class will be Lewis Class prize pay back.

Registration will be 8 am to noon. With the first flight course at 10 am. Warm up's will be at the 5 Stand at \$5 per round.

This shoot is very labor intensive and to provide a successful shoot we need between 14 and 24 volunteers to assist in providing service to the shooters.

Volunteers will be the essential key to our success. I thank each and every one in advance for your assistance. Lunch will be provided to all volunteers and at a \$5 charge for observers.


Clackamas County CHL Update

As we know, the Sheriff's office is no longer sending out renewal notices for concealed handgun permits. This is only temporary. Here's the deal: An unnamed advocacy group complained that the wording on the renewal notices was too specific and, if mail was stolen or otherwise fell into hands of other than the intended recipient, it would identify the individuals who possess weapons. (So??) Well, that has prompted the Sheriff's department to review and revise the wording so that the new renewal notices will not specify handguns but rather identify only that a permit is due to expire, not what type of permit. (And this will help?? Only if the mail thief is **stupid!**)

The new notices are due to be distributed beginning in June or July of this year. Upon receipt of the notice, the individual will need to call the Sheriff's office at 503/353-4636 and schedule a renewal appointment. The Sheriff's office suggest that the permit holder arrive about 10-15 min. early to fill out some paperwork. The location is at their Training Center located

at 12700 SE 82nd Ave. in Clackamas. The fee is \$50 for 4 years (Plus \$15 for fingerprinting, etc. *if* you are a new applicant). I hope this helps.
