### **Presidents Report**



### Fire & Drought Information General Safety Tips

from ODFW web site

Fire and weather conditions can affect people heading to public and private lands in Oregon for hunting, fishing and wildlife viewing. Anyone planning recreational activities should check to see if fire closures or restrictions will affect them. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has compiled the following information resources to keep outdoor recreationists informed. For additional information, visit ODFW's "Fire and Drought Information" Web page at http://www.dfw.state.or.us/Fire/ fire\_drought.htm.

#### **Tips For All Outdoor Recreationalists**

- Follow all regulations and userestrictions posted to safeguard natural resources.
- In some cases, local potable water sources may be limited or unavailable. Check ahead and carry extra water to ensure an adequate supply.
- When traveling in remote areas, bring a fire extinguisher, water, shovel, and ax or Pulaski in your vehicle to use in the event you spot a recently ignited fire.
- Check local outdoor smoking regulations. If smoking is permitted, be safe - smoke only within a threefoot cleared area.
- Use an ashtray and rush cigarettes until they are cold.
- Do not throw cigarette butts out the car window.
- Do not park vehicles in grassy areas, and be aware of road closures.
- Maintain functional spark arrestors on OHV's (Off Highway Vehicles).
- Never place hot equipment on the ground in uncleared
- Allow lanterns, stoves and heaters to cool before refueling them.
- Campfires should be drowned in water until cold. Never leave campfires unattended.
- Plan to pack out your trash in remote areas and take extra caution to remove any potentially flammable materials.

#### Tips for Hunters

- Carry extra water.
- Do not overexert yourself.
- Bring a field-oriented medical kit.
- Minimize mid-day activities.
- Utilize shade cover.
- Be aware of fire restrictions. Check the web or call land management agencies for most current information.
- Avoid camping near waterholes.
   Wildlife also experience critical needs for water during hot dry times.
   Human activity near limited watering areas can force wildlife to travel many miles to find another water source
