Our tactical shotgun bay (TSB) is now available for use by our members. For those that may not know, we got the go ahead to build a tactical shotgun bay for the nonaerial firing of shotguns. So long as we contain all shot within the bay we are okay. While aerial shotgun shooting is still not allowed on our ranges this will allow members to pattern shoot their shotguns as well as low level firing of shotguns within our three gun and speed steel disciplines. This also will help accommodate our law enforcement friends and hopefully bring more of their business back to help our revenues. If you need to use the TSB it is located at the silhouette range and there are some specific rules for its use. While the board fully understands this does not solve the aerial shotgun shooting issue it is a step in the right direction.
