Quigley Match 2017

Here is a recap of the 2017 DRRC "team" match results at the Matthew Quigley Buffalo Rifle Match in Forsyth, Montana on June 17th and 18th. Six hundred and forty-one shooters attended. Competitors included representatives from six foreign countries: Australia, Canada, Germany, Great Britain, Czech Republic, and Slovakia.

Six of us from DRRC traveled the 1,000 plus miles to Al Lee's steer pasture 8.5 miles out of Forsyth. Five shooters and one visitor made the trip. Myself, brother Jim Kendall, my grandson Grant Kendall, Steve Irving, and Jack Regele were the shooting contestants. Flip Flippin was the visitor.

There are 6 targets to shoot at Quigley, 350 yd offhand, 417 yd square, 405 yd diamond, 530 yd small rectangle, 600 vd octagon and finally, a life-size buffalo at 805 yds. All targets except the offhand are shot from a sitting position off cross-sticks. No shooting jackets, slings, bi-pods or prone positions allowed. The only scopes allowed must be period type scopes of the 1800's. All of these are only a small part of this match. The real conditions that make this match a challenge are the wind conditions and general weather. That week the wind, every day, was 30-35 mph sustained and qusty.

You may be curious to know that individually and as a team we set a record for score that will probably never be equaled....our scores were the lowest any or all of us had shot in the past 8 years at Forsyth. Just to put it in perspective, we shot 3 targets on Saturday, 8 rounds each for a possible total of 24. High score (hit or miss) was a 3 way tie of 6 hits. By the end of shooting on Sunday our team had a 3 way tie of

19 of 48 possible. Steve Irving shot high score for the DRRC bunch with 20/48 hits. Keep in mind that in the 26 years of this match there has NEVER been a perfect score 48/48. And the high score for men this year was a 7 way tie of 37 and one 38. The one outstanding score of 43/48 this year was shot by Dave Gullo of Buffalo Arms, Inc.
