Mini Palma

The Mini Palma "season" is over. This summer we had 3 matches and the level of interest was good especially considering the matches were held on Monday evenings. The general turnout was ten to twelve participants. The plan for next year (starting in about May) is for one Monday evening and one weekend late afternoon match each month for two matches a month.

For those curious about the whole "Mini-Palma" concept, imagine a combination of bench rest rifle and Palma rifle all fired at 100 yards with 22LR! These truly are FUN matches, with 4 classes for most any taste or pocketbook. The competitors shoot in "match" or "sporter" class, scoped, or iron sights. A wide variety of rifles have turned up to shoot, everything from 10-22's to Anschutz match rifles. The sights and glass on top of the rifles are nearly as varied, from a truly wretched 40 year old Bushnell .22 scope (on the author's rifle) to a threatened Nightforce scope for next season! Anything is welcome as long as it shoots a .22LR cartridge. The targets that are used for this match are "mini-Palma" 800, 900, and 1,000 yard reduced targets, which although challenging, will allow themselves to be cleaned on rare occasion. The combination of smaller targets and the effect of wind on a slow light projectile make for a very interesting match. It is a great place to practice trigger control as a slight twitch on the trigger can make that little 40gr.

It's Time

As the year fast approaches the holidays, and citizens are in the woods enjoying their various hunting trips, it is time to start thinking about next year's adventures.

The State of Oregon Hunter Education Program instructs young people and adults about firearm care & safety, wildlife identification, conservation, survival skills, map and compass use, and proper care of game animals. Students as young as 8 years old learn from the volunteer instructors who gladly share their outdoor knowledge and wisdom with hunters. Oregon requires young hunters, who turn 12 by the time of a big game hunt, to have a Hunter Education Certificate in their possession to hunt anywhere except on land owned by their parents or legal guardians.

Each year, numerous Oregon hunters also hunt out-of-state and in Canada. Most of these destinations require Hunter Education Certificates for any hunter, of any age, either before applying to hunt or before purchasing the licenses and tags for their trip.

The Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife (ODFW) relies on volunteer instructors to accomplish these education courses. Each volunteer instructor sets their own class schedule and conducts their courses according to State standards. Most courses are typically multiple classes taking place over a few weeks in the evening. Instructors are not paid or compensated in any way for their hard work and efforts. They do it

because they want to see others enjoy the benefits of the outdoors. Instructors are just like you; they are people who love to camp, hunt, fish, and also like to spend their free time in the woods. They want to be outdoors in the summer and early fall, looking for that pristine new campsite, or scouting out the locations of game for their own hunts.

That said, you need to start thinking now about getting your young hunter into these classes so they will be ready for the hunt next vear. Almost all instructors have their courses in the winter and spring (before turkey hunting starts in April). Summer classes are often fragmented by vacations, team sports or other activities that interrupt the continuity of the courses. Schools rooms are also harder to schedule for the summer sessions so many instructors do not schedule courses then. For a list of courses by county check the postings on the ODFW website at, www.dfw.state.or.us. Click on the "Outdoor Education" heading, click on "Hunter Education Class Listing" and follow the directions for each instructor's class. You may also contact ODFW at 503 947-6018 for a list of scheduled classes. If you can't find one that fits your schedule, check the website frequently as instructors post their courses monthly.

Each year, many Oregon hunters cannot go out of state or take their young hunter on that first deer or elk trip because they failed to plan accordingly. If you don't start early enough, you may not be able to find a class to attend. Most classes fill up quickly; and most instructors are through teaching their classes by summer. Your youngster will be pretty upset if you failed to enroll them, and you will be embarrassed when you can't find a class for your student, or if you've made arrangements to take that lifetime hunt and can't find a course to attend. Plan early! The instructors want to be in the field like you do so they won't be having courses in the fall. The Hunter Education Program always has a need for more volunteer instructors. If you are age 21 or older, never had a criminal conviction or wildlife law conviction, and want to pass along our hunting heritage to the next generation, contact ODFW at 503.947.6018, or contact any instructor for additional information.

For those hunters who took a course but can't find your card, you can obtain a duplicate copy by calling, faxing, or mailing your request to ODFW, Hunter Education, 3406 Cherry St. NE Salem, OR. 97303, 503 947-6018 or fax 503 947-6009. They should have records back to the mid 1960's.

If you've got that trip of a lifetime, or if you've got a young hunter about
