Gate Access Card 101

A couple of recent phone calls to the Club concerned gate access cards. This gave me the idea to give some reminders about your access cards, especially since, if like me, you barely remember your orientation discussion.

Each electronic access card (technically, a HID card) is coded for a specific member. Recently a member who was unable to renew for various circumstances asked what to do with his access card, and was concerned about having to re-key the gate if the card was unaccounted for. That is not the case. Whenever a member fails to renew, the access card that is specific for that member is turned off in the system so that the gate mechanism will not recognize it as a valid card, and access is denied. All of our dues are renewed at the same time, with a July general membership meeting due date, and each year there are members who do not get the payment in on time. After the first Membership meeting in July, any members unpaid need to be updated in the gate system and have their key cards turned off. Then as many of them inevitably catch up and pay the dues, each one has to be reactivated individually. As you can imagine, this is extra workload for the Vice President, who has the task of managing member renewals. Thus, that is one reason why we stress paying the dues on time each year.

If you must end your membership, you can return your access card to the Club, and we will refund you \$5, which is the deposit you paid when you initially were given your card. Drop it off, mail it in, whatever,



and we'll send you your deposit.

Since each access card is member specific, the gate system also records which cards were used to access the gate. This is another good reason to never loan your key card to anyone, besides the fact that it is totally against Club rules.

If you have ever reached the Club gate and realized you left your key card at home, like I have, maybe you leave the key card and member ID badge in your vehicle so that won't happen again. We recently got another phone call at the Club, from a Good Samaritan who found a member's ID badge in her driveway. She looked up the Club info, and called us so we could let the member know how to contact her and recover it. It turns out that the member's car had been broken into, and the (blankety blank) thieves had stolen the ID badge, then ditched it when they figured out they couldn't sell it. Fortunately, they didn't keep the member card and use it to access the Club for more adventures in crime. So if you ever have your access card stolen, or you lose it for sure, please contact the Club so we can deactivate the stolen or missing card, and issue you a new one. That way you can get back to shooting right away and no low life will be using your key card to help fund his wayward lifestyle.

Work Projects and Maintenance Activity

This summer was especially busy for Ron Carey and the members who helped him on the work projects and maintenance at the Club. After much planning, the working portion of the project to remove sediment from the Corps Ditch and recovery of lead from the shooting impact berms began in August. The brush along both sides of the ditch was removed by a contractor, using a tractor and a brush cutter on a hydraulic arm. A good sized crew of members installed silt barrier fences and erosion wattles. Dewatering equipment was rented and brought to the site. Then Doug Johnson, DRRC member and contractor extraordinaire, dredged the ditch. The water was separated from the sediment, various samples were taken and tests conducted, and the sediment was hauled off the property. The water tested OK, and was drained on site.

Doug Johnson also removed the surface faces of all the shooting berms, and stockpiled the dirt according to source. In September a shaker screening machine was rented, and the various piles of dirt were screened multiple times to separate the material into different categories: rocks and clods, fine dirt, and dirt with lead fragments. At the same time, new gravel was installed on all of the shooting berms. To complete the 1000 Yard berm, several of the number boards had to be removed to allow access for the gravel truck, and then the boards were reinstalled with new sleeves to allow for future removal.

The rented equipment was cleaned and returned to suppliers. The dirt containing lead fragments was fenced, and will be processed on site to extract or mitigate the lead. The fencing along the west side of the property at the ditch was rebuilt, as it had to be removed to complete the brush removal. The barriers and fences were removed, and put in storage as they can most likely be resold. The project costs are still being compiled by our Treasurer, and will be reported soon. At the October meeting, Ron Carey expressed great thanks and appreciation to all of the members who helped get the project work completed.

In addition to all of that work, a few other things were done. A new roof was installed on the Clubhouse. A new strobe light was installed at the 100 Yard range. New clangers were made and installed. New signs were installed around the range. Parking barriers were installed near the Clubhouse to protect the grass and underground pipes. A new ticket booth was built for the Hunter Sight-In check-in station, replacing the borrowed tent from past years. An overhang at the Tactical Shotgun Bay was worked on, to provide a covered space for scorekeeping, etc. at that range. All of the 1000 Yard number boards were repainted. A dangerous tree was removed near the Clubhouse, as well as a snag by the Ag Building. The fairways were just treated with lime to keep them at the proper pH. The wetland area with the native plantings was inspected, and

cleaned up to remove invasive brush. Brush was mowed in a portion of the trees between the Archery Range and the Known Distance Range. Bids and permits were obtained for various projects still in the planning stage. Oh yeah, and the usual grass mowing, weed cutting and weed spraying continued unabated all summer. Many thanks to the
