
Annual Christmas Party

Quigley Match 2015

Five of us from the DRRC Black Powder Cartridge Rifle discipline made our annual trek to Forsythe Montana for the Mathew Quigley Black Powder Match last June 20-21. Our "team" consisted of six shooters: Dave Kendall, Jim Kendall, Tad Kendall, Jack Regele, Steve Irving (all from DRRC), and Bob Powell from Alberta, Canada. Bob has been there every year for the past 5 or 6 years and likes our company so we always shoot together as a team.

For those who aren't familiar with the Quigley Match, it is 6 target stations at distances from 350 yards out to 805 yards. The match is 8 rounds fired at each of the six stations, no sighters, in any and all weather conditions. The real fun is waiting your turn to shoot since the average signup every year is 600+ shooters. 48 rounds are fired in total, scored by "hit or miss". Sound easy? You should know that if you manage to get 30 or more hits you are in the top 15% of all shooters! 40 hits and you are in the top 5%! This is no walk on the beach!!

The weather was good (for Montana), windy as usual but no thunderstorms or flash flooding on the range during competition. Nevertheless, our team members did not shoot their best scores this trip, but a great time was had by all. The top score for our six was turned in by Dave Kendall with 27/48, not quite up to his best score of 32/48 but still a good show. This year a first time shooter at this match scored

43/48. And the overall best score in the competition was 44/48.

Service Rifle Match

The Service Rifle Discipline has not had a match since August, but they will close out the 2015 year with their customary December match, shot under cover at the 100 Yard Range, on Saturday, December 12th. Discipline Director Todd Hanson has purchased two "new" M1 Garands from the Civilian Marksmanship Program, so there are plenty of Club M1s available for shooters to borrow for the competition. Ammunition is also available for purchase for new shooters. In addition, there are AR-15s available for junior shooters not ready for the Garand. Shooters may also use their own equipment, including any service correct rifle.

New shooters should sign up to attend the Service Rifle Clinic Friday night before the match. To sign up, use the link on the Service Rifle page of the Club web site. Registration for the match is at 8 am in the Clubhouse, with shooting beginning at 9 am.

These matches always have a good mix of experienced shooters and shooters new to competitions, and it is a great way to get a start in highpower competition.

Oregon Military Museum

At the November General Meeting, representatives of the Oregon Military Museum made a presentation about the museum. David Warden and Louis Miller gave us a report on the museum, which is undergoing a \$14.6 million renovation. Located at Camp Withycombe in Clackamas, the museum currently houses over 14,000 artifacts and archives, dating back to the 1850s. Included are rare weapons, prisoner-of-war relics, tanks, and uniforms. Officially to be known as The Brigadier General James B. Thayer Oregon Military Museum, it will include a historic park, a tracks and treads vehicle display, and an honor garden outside. Inside, there will be the main exhibition hall, a weapons gallery, a library and archives room, and two changing exhibit halls. There will also be various artifact and weapons preservation rooms. The displays will honor all service

Fundraising for the museum is being done by the Historical Outreach Foundation. There will be a Walk of Honor made up of memorial bricks. The memorial bricks are projected to be installed a year from now. Donations to have a brick in the Walk of Honor range from \$200 for a one line brick, \$225 for a two line brick, \$250 for a three line brick, to \$1,000 for a large

Those wishing to contribute towards a DRRC purchase of a brick can send a donation to the Club, identified as a Military Museum donation, and we will bundle them together and donate them to the Walk of Honor project.
