The Holidays are over, the house is cleaned up and everything is back in its place. We are into the gray days and you are bored and need something to do. Now is a great time to take a shooting class. Learn how to shoot, learn how to shoot better or learn how to shoot that new gun that Santa brought you. Take a beginning class or if you can shoot already to an intermediate shooting class to pick up on a few techniques and improve your skills. Shooting is a diminishing skill and if you don't keep up the practice and training

it goes away at a good pace.

As an instructor I'd like to see more people with concealed handgun licenses take classes and learn to shoot, then learn some skills towards personal protection. If you don't know how to effectively use that gun and practice you could be getting to deep water should you have to draw and defend yourself or family. Talk to an instructor so you know what skills you'll acquire in the class. Also make sure you are comfortable with the instructor. If you don't like the instructor you won't learn as much. Be truthful with the instructor about your skills. Remember you have to walk before you can run. It takes an instructor about five minutes watching you shoot to know what your abilities are. If you can't hit a target on demand and you get into a class that requires shooting on the move you are wasting everyone's time. You will be slowing down the class.




