# Columbia Willamette Rifle League

A lot of club members have wondered what CWRL stood for in the newsletter. Here is a bit of history of CWRL. Douglas Ridge joined the league just after the indoor range was built and has had a team competing every year since. This may be the last year that DRRC will have a team as the interest has dropped. We have only 6 members shooting this year and one or two may retire after this year. You would think that a club of more than 800 members that there would be a bit more interest in this type of shooting. If you would like more information please call Lou Westwick at 503/263-6584. It would be a shame to see our club not competing anymore. The matches are 4-position smallbore fired at 50 feet, scopes are allowed.

The Original League, established in 1934, consisted of 13 teams competing over a 20-week schedule. Teams came from an area around Portland. They included 2 teams from the Portland Club, and one each of the following: Vancouver, Gresham, Forest Grove, Mt. Hood, Rose City, Oregon Club (Sandy), Sportsman Assoc., Sellwood, Corbett, Comp. B Ore NG, and the 7th Infantry, Vancouver.

Over the years many clubs fielded various numbers of teams and many clubs came and left.

Some names that the old timers might remember follow:

Portland Oaks, Pines, Willows, Maples, Old Crows, Gresham Wildcats, Bobcats, Tomcats Vancouver Grizzlies, Bears, Cubs, 6387th, Hillsboro Eagles, Falcons, Hawks Hyster Pioneers, Challengers, carriers, Winches, Mt. Hood Cougars Interior Bison's, ESCO, Johnson Creek Yankees, Rebels Troutdale Pointers, Acorns, The Dalles\ Reserve Chinooks, 313th, P.O. E. Targetteers, Montavilla Indians, Portland Air Base: Delta Daggers, Sunset Apollos, Tri County Wolves, Foxes, Clatskanie Muskrats

In 1961-62 the league had 24 teams and nearly 300 shooters. Of

the 300 shooters in 1961 there are still 6 active members in the League, Arnold Cork, Maurice Bliss, John Bird, Richard Holzmeyer and Cliff Sharp and Fred Frimberger. Currently there are 10 teams and not quite 100 competitors. The League operates on a shoulder-to-shoulder match program, each team firing home and away against all other teams in the league. The average of the five high members on each team are used to establish the teams ranking into one of usually three divisions. This year it appears that the 'A' division will have 3 teams, the 'B' division 3 teams and the 'C' division 4 teams.

The League functions under a 6-member board, Pres. 4 VPs and a Sec/Treasurer. The Pres. and VPs are voting members the Sec/Treas. is not. They all run for a 2-year term. No club can have two members on the board unless one member is the Sec/Treas. At every Awards Banquet three board members are elected and three are carried over.

Teams awards are for League Champion and 1<sup>st</sup> place in each Division. In the case of 4 teams in a division there may be a 2<sup>nd</sup> place award.

Individual awards are given for NRA classes of Master, Expert, SS, and Marksman. The Master and Expert Classes have 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place awards for Sit, Kn and OH. The SS and Marksman classes have 1st, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place awards for prone, sit, Kn and OH.

Out of the 18 matches fired a competitor must fire in at least 14 matches to be eligible for individual awards. Junior shooters must fire a minimum of 10 matches. High aggregate awards are also presented to Hi Junior, Hi Lady, and High Iron Sight Non Junior member. On occasion special awards may be given for 100s OH or 400 Scores.

At the League banquet all League members receive a pin or brassard designed for the current year as a memento.

Hope this gives you some idea about the CWRL.
