Tactical Shotgun Bay

DRRC now has a Tactical Shotgun Bay (TSB) next to the Silhouette Range. Although it is not yet finished it is open for business. Until the Bay is done (side safety berms built) the rules are:

- The Tactical Shotgun Bay (TSB) may not be used by the general membership during a scheduled event at the Silhouette Range, unless approved by the event Director.
- Users may not shoot at the Silhouette Range if there are

shooters at the TSB farther than the firing line at the Silhouette Range.

- "Cease Fires" are effective for both Ranges ("Cease Fires" at either Range affects the other).
- The TSB is to be used only for:
- Shotguns must be pointed lower than the top of the impact berm (no aerial shooting).
- Shotguns are to be used to the North (left, when facing up range) of the two trees.
- Paper targets may be placed at any distance from the impact berm, as long as there are no safety issues.
- Metal targets must be placed at the impact berm and can only be used if no shooting is occurring on the Silhouette Range.
- THE TREES ARE NOT TARGETS OR BACKSTOPS. DO NOT HANG TARGETS ON TREES

Complete SOPs are posted at the TSB and the Silhouette Range. New SOPs will be posted when the side safety berms are done.

Mandatory Reporting

ODFW website

This year, hunters are *required* to complete the hunter harvest report online or by calling 1-866-947-ODFW (6339) and using the automated phone system. Do the report for each and every big game tag you purchase (except for bighorn sheep and Rocky Mountain goat tags) and for your turkey tags, even if you were not successful. Keep in mind you may still get a call from ODFW's telephone survey for data comparison purposes.

By completing the mandatory hunter report, you are providing key pieces of information that biologists will use in their game management. Your report supports the agency's goal of optimizing recreational opportunities for all hunters. ODFW thanks hunters for their cooperation.
