

The Small Bore Rifle team known as Esco hadn't actually shot at an Esco (technically Hyster) shooting range since the mid-1980's when I-205 construction wiped out their range near Rocky Butte. But the team has continued to compete in the seventy-eight year old Columbia Willamette Rifle League ever since, often through the kindness of other ranges. Over the years, the team shot at a now defunct range in Gresham, at Johnson Creek Gun Club, Portland Rifle and Pistol Club, and Vancouver Rifle and Pistol Club.

Also, the team no longer had any members who were active employees of Esco; team captain Glen Miller, an Esco retiree, was the last remaining link to the team's origins. But there were some team members who were also members of Douglas Ridge, such as John Frentress and Stan Pate. And Douglas Ridge's own Adult Small Bore team had faded away back in 2005. So, in 2010, the Esco team found a new home, and became the Douglas Ridge team. The core team leaders, Bob Stevens and Glen Miller, joined DRRC and became the Discipline Director and Assistant Director, respectively. Many other team members also joined DRRC, or were already members. The rest pay guest fees for their participation. Since 2010, the team membership has grown as other DRRC members have taken up the sport and signed up to participate. Bob Stevens said, "Glen and I as co-captains and coaches for the team could not be happier with the camaraderie and excitement we see in our teammates. We feel that moving to DRRC has really opened the door to bringing

Several team and individual honors were presented at the league banquet on April 13th. The Douglas Ridge/Esco team took first place in league, capturing 54 out of a possible 60 points, and beating the multiple year defending champions Tri-County Wolves by 2 points. Bob Stevens lead the team and was 3rd overall best average shooter in the league, with a 4-position average of 396.82 (out of 400) for the season. Andrew Roland from Tri-County led the league with a 398.83 average, and Ron Nelson of The Dalles was 2nd with a 397.78 average.

Other team members who placed in the league top ten were #5 Ryan Jacobs (394.89), #6 Glen Miller (393.80) and #9 Spencer Jacobs (392.36). Both Ryan and Spencer participate in and honed their skills in the DRRC Junior Small Bore program.

Other awards for the DRRC team members include: Most Improved (Expert) – Spencer Jacobs, Most Improved (Master) – Bob Stevens, and Most Improved (League) – Levi Clark. Levi is another shooter from the DRRC Junior Program who was rated as Marksman, but jumped to Expert with his performance this season. Elliot Tukua moved from Marksman to Sharpshooter, Bill Keenan moved from Sharpshooter to Expert, and Ryan Jacobs and Spencer Jacobs moved from Expert to Master.

Spencer Jacobs won League 1st Sub-Junior (14 and under), and Levi Clark was 2nd Sub-Junior. Ryan Jacobs was High League Junior (all classes).
