Work Hours 101

As of this writing our renewal statements were mailed six days ago and already I've had many phone calls and emails questioning earned work hours or the work hours assessment. Most are simply a matter of not understanding how it works so here is a quick Work Hours 101 lesson.

1. If you are required to put in the 8 hour minimum of volunteer work hours and you don't, you will be billed a \$150.00 work hour assessment at renewal time.

2. There is no proration for less hours worked. It is either put in the full 8 hours or pay the \$150.00.
3. If you do not turn in the club approved signed work slip you will not get credit for the work hours. They must be put in the green box located in the club house.
4. If your work hours slip is not complete you will not get credit for your work hours.
5. If you trust someone else to submit your work hours slip for you and they don't do it, you will not get credit for your work hours.
6. Our annual work day is typically held in April and it is the last day work hours can be earned for that membership year. That day is also the last day work hours slips can be turned in for that membership year.
7. It is your responsibility to complete your work hours, complete the

Black Powder Cartridge

I am pleased to announce that Douglas Ridge Rifle Club has embraced a new shooting discipline, Black Powder Cartridge. The intent is to provide an organized outlet for people interested in shooting black powder cartridge rifles with cast lead bullets and black powder. Typically these rifles will be original or replicas of the rifles used during the buffalo-hunting era. They can be lever action, but single shot seem to be the most common i.e., rolling blocks, 1885 Winchesters and Sharps.

This new discipline was prompted by the interest exhibited by several members of our club. We had a few classes that were well attended, including a bullet casting session and a range day. As a result five of us attended the Matthew Quigley Buffalo Rifle Match in Forsyth, Montana on Father's Day last year. It was the first time for some of us, though for two it was their third visit. The event attracts over 600 competitors from most every state and several foreign countries. The targets are steel and of various shapes including a full sized buffalo. There are 8 shots fired at six targets at ranges

from 300 yards to 780 yards. The match covers Saturday and Sunday, and the range is open for practice from Monday to Friday of the preceding week.

Since this is a new discipline and I have never been a discipline director, this is an opportunity for all of us to grow together in this sport. I am a firm believer in team effort and look forward to us building on a great sport.

As a result of starting this discipline, there is a need for Range Safety Officers. Michael Jones says he can accommodate an RSO class as small as 4 people. 
RSO Class Coming
