Friday night competitions were held from December through the first part of April against six other teams in the CWRL (Columbia Willamette Rifle League) the format being a double rotation of all the teams. The DRRC team is the largest in the league, consisting of 18 members, three that were new to the team. The season ended with an Award Banquet held at the Portlander Inn on April 21st where all the individual and team awards were presented by the Columbia Willamette Rifle League president (and DRRC member) Glen Miller. Some of the individual

honors that went to members of our team include, “1st Expert, Kneeling Position” to Tracy Keenan, “High Elder Aggregate” (over age 70) to Merv Bergstrom, “3rd Sharpshooter Aggregate and “2nd Sharpshooter Standing Position” to Spencer Jacobs”, “1st Marksman Prone Position” to Don Byers, and 6th place overall to Bob Stevens. The team itself netted the 2nd place award in the “A” Division of the league.

Great excitement was generated during the later part of April as we followed our teammates Ryan and Spencer Jacobs as they competed in the Jr. Olympics held in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Spencer came home with a medal in each of the three events J3 (14 years old and under division) he competed in. Gold in the Men’s Air Rifle, Gold in the Men’s 50 Meter Three Position, and Silver for the Prone match. Elder brother Ryan, competing in the J1 (18-21 years old), though not in the running for a medal, shot his personal best during the first day of the Men’s 50 meter 3P and endured a mechanical failure of the electronic scoring system on the second day. We are very proud to have young people of such great character and maturity as a part of our team!

pieces of equipment necessary to shoot small bore. Included in this purchase were two Anschutz 1903 rifles, sights, slings, kneeling rolls, palm rests, and shooting jackets. This new equipment allows juniors participating in our program to excel in ways that was otherwise prohibited by equipment limitations.

Another necessary piece of equipment to the sport is spotting scopes. Last year, Leupold provided three scopes to the club at a reasonable price. These scopes have been extensively used by several of our shooters. With all three scopes being fully utilized, I inquired about the possibility of purchasing three more scopes with next year's budget. After hearing we needed more, Leupold has contributed three more spotting scopes at no cost.
