Friends of the NRA Dinner


Douglas Ridge has received several grants from the National Rifle Association Foundation over recent years. In 2015 an NRA Foundation grant funded the new red light system on the Silhouette Range. In previous years NRA grants provided funding for firearms and equipment for the Ladies Beginner Pistol classes. The Club currently has an application pending for the Junior Smallbore program.

The funds for these grants do not come from your NRA dues. They come from the Friends of the NRA; specifically from the FONRA fundraising dinners and events held all over the country. Half of the proceeds from the dinners are dedicated to support shooting sports projects in the state where the funds were raised; the other half of the funds support shooting projects on a national scale. Last year, over \$360,000 was granted by the NRA Foundation for projects in Oregon.

The Portland Friends of the NRA dinner is Saturday April 16th, at the Doubletree Hotel on NE Multnomah. The event features good food, adult beverages, auctions, games, and chances to win guns. Last year seventy-two guns were given away to attendees at the dinner. The price of a ticket is \$55.

Someone has put rounds through the ceiling in the Indoor Range. This is an act that must stop immediately. Mr. Ron Carey got on top of the roof and repaired it before more rain that would have caused damage. Currently, there is absolutely no holsters to be drawn from on the Indoor Range unless you are under the watchful eye of a certified instructor. This range was constructed for the practice of marksmanship, not dynamic usage. If you want to do that you must go to the Dynamic Range. Remember, If your feet are on concrete, no holsters! This is a safety issue.

So before you blow my phone off the desk, I don't know who did this, or when. That is probably a good thing. If you read this and were the responsible person, maybe you should invest in some lessons before you cause an accident. Remember, this is considered vandalism and if caught, you may be suspended depending on Board action. Having Mr. Carey on the roof or causing extra work for the Tuesday crew is frowned upon. State Clay Target League

In 2001, Jim Sable of Minnesota retired from his career in Marketing and looked forward to spending his days helping out at the gun club. One day a large truck delivering pallets of targets and shot shells arrived and the word went out for the younger members of the club to turn out and help with unloading. Jim, possessing a keen sense of the obvious, looked around and realized he, at 62 years old, was the youngest member in the gun club. He quickly ascertained that his favorite gun club would soon be closed like many others without a substantial influx of new, young, shooters in a short time period.

Well, Mr. Sable also possesses much patience and, after 15 years, the Minnesota High School Clay Target League is an "overnight success". In 2016, the Minnesota State High School Clay Target League spring league expects more than 10,000 student athletes representing more than 300 high school teams that are coached by more than 3,000 volunteers that are participating at more than 175 gun clubs throughout Minnesota. Trap shooting is so

popular in Minnesota that several mothballed gun ranges have reopened and the 2015 Minnesota Legislature appropriated \$2 million for expansion of the gun ranges where the kids compete.

Why am telling you this? Well, you see the folks in Minnesota have been expanding their program to other states the last couple of years. The Clay Target League is now in Wisconsin, North Dakota and, this year it's come to Oregon.

Douglas Ridge Rifle Club is host to the very first Oregon State High School Clay Target League Club sanctioned in Oregon. We have successfully signed up a team of 9 shooters from the Oregon City High School. Major Douglas Thomas is a teacher and JROTC instructor at the High School and has graciously agreed to be the clubs' advisor at the school.

The Clay Target League functions as a spring club sport. Their league begins the first week of April and continues nine weeks and terminates in June with their State Tournament. The team must shoot two rounds (50 targets) for score each week. They compete with other like sized clubs in their league. They will shoot at DRRC and I'll enter their scores online to see how they stand up to the other shooters in their league. The youth athletes will be shooting at DRRC on Wednesday afternoons so come by and see what we are doing!

On behalf of the youth shooters and Parents in the Youth Shotgun Program I would like to thank you for supporting the youth shooting opportunities at Douglas Ridge through your membership in the Club.

As provided in our club Bylaws elected board members serve a two year term of office with an option to serve an additional term if elected. Board member terms are divided so that half of the Board members are up for election in any given year.

Two current Board members have completed one term and are eligible to run again.

Elected members of the Board serve a two year term and may serve a second two year term if reelected. Members nominated will be presented to the membership at the June membership meeting. The election of new Directors will take place at the July Annual Meeting of the Members.
