Teach Hunter Education

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) recently honored 93 certified instructors in the Hunter Education Program for individually serving 20 or more years of volunteer service, the longest being 43 years. The longevity of this volunteer program is a testament of a truly rewarding experience in teaching important life skills to the next generation.

More instructors are needed to lead classes and Field Days at DRRC. ODFW provides all the equipment plus training for new instructors. All Instructor teams are given hands on teaching tools and creative lesson plans for the student.

Oregon certifies 5,000 new hunters per year across the State of Oregon. "Our club members can help coach youth on field days, but we do need a handful of members to step up and volunteer to get fully certified as a hunter education instructors." Said Bill Hendrix the Douglas Rifle Range.

Volunteer Instructors are encouraged to teach a minimum of 2 classes per year and earn points to win special prizes based on the number of hours they volunteer.

To apply, call 503/947-6028 for an application, which includes a quiz of some basic hunter education and firearm safety knowledge.


Under Oregon law, persons under the age of 18 must pass a Hunter Education class before they can hunt. The classes cover important issues including hunter ethics and respect for private landowners; wildlife management and identification; firearms handling and safety; hunt preparation and techniques; survival; and introductory bowhunting. All classes are taught by certified volunteers dedicated to passing on the tradition of hunting to future generations.

NRA Grant

Membership Renewal

Every Club Senior member, Oldtime member, and Life member will be receiving a membership renewal statement in early May. There are no changes to the dues. All memberships expire June 30, and if a renewal statement is not returned with the appropriate payment, your gate card will be deactivated after the Annual Meeting of the Members in July. Members who fail to renew will receive a Second Notice sometime later in July. No additional reminders are sent after the Second Notice.

Please review your statement, and update or correct any errors in spelling, telephone numbers, home address or email address. If an email address is missing, please provide one if you use email. If your birth year is listed, but not your birth day, please provide the actual date. If you have extended your NRA membership or changed your NRA status, for example, to Life member, please update that information.

Every Member should return their statement, even if no fees are due. It greatly helps us in processing the renewals, ensuring the NRA membership is current, and getting the gate access card updated. It also lets us know you are still alive, and still an active member. Payments need

to be by personal check, cashier's check, money order, or cash. No plastic cards. You can mail your payment and statement, or you can drop off your renewal at the Club. Use the lock box in the Clubhouse on the wall next to the office door. All renewals must be paid in full. Partial payments will be held unprocessed until full payment is received.

If you are charged \$40 for NRA Dues, it is because the Club maintains an NRA expiration date for all Annual NRA members. The amount is increased because the NRA has raised their dues. If our records indicate your NRA membership expires before July 1, 2016, we automatically include an NRA Dues Assessment on your statement. If you already renewed your NRA membership, cross off the \$40 charge on the statement and adjust your Total Due amount. Return a NRA magazine address label or a copy of your current NRA membership card, showing your updated NRA expiration date, with your renewal. If you have not yet renewed your NRA membership, you can pay the \$40 fee, and the Club will renew your NRA membership for one year, or you can renew directly with the NRA for one or more years. If you renew directly, please provide proof of your NRA renewal, such as an acknowledgement email.

All Senior members are required to contribute a minimum of 8 hours work for the Club, or pay the \$150 Work Assessment Fee. If we do not have 8 or more hours recorded by you and your associate and junior members, we add the \$150 fee to your renewal. The work hours must have been completed by the end of the Annual Work Day on April 16th. There is no carryover of work hours from previous years. If you know you worked the hours, but we did not reflect it on your statement, we have all the work slips that were turned in. Hopefully, you have some note or record of your work. We can look for a slip to see if there was a recording error. If there is no work slip and no record of you working, you may be out of luck. If you were unable to complete work hours, due to extenuating circumstances, you can appeal for relief to the Board of Directors, in person at a Board meeting or in writing.

If you can't pay your renewal now, you can pay later. You can pay your dues any time during the 2016/17 Club year, but they will not be prorated for time that you were not able

to access the Club before renewing. After receipt of your renewal payment, your gate access card will be reactivated. If you don't renew during the Club year, you cannot renew next year. At the end of the Club year, all non-renewed members are changed to Inactive status. They are no longer members. To gain access to the Club again, they must apply to be reinstated by rejoining the Club. If approved, the Initiation Fee is reduced, but other One-time costs must be paid again. Inactive Oldtime members who rejoin revert to Senior status, and have the Senior member dues and work hours obligations again. Attendance at a New Member Orientation class may be required.

Appeals for waivers or other adjustments can be made to the Board of Directors, in person or in writing. Decisions of the Board are final.

Court Justice Antonin Scalia had died. All I could think was, "we are in big trouble now!" Are these kids going to have the same opportunities that we have grown up with and have taken for granted; the right to keep and bear arms granted to us by the Constitution?

Last year, during the legislative session, several of us went to Salem and tried to testify at a gun bill hearing on behalf of the club's 1400+ members. We didn't get to testify, and the bill narrowly passed along party lines. Afterword, we talked about forming a group from the club to try and make a difference in Salem. Not just a reactionary group to go down to quickly scheduled hearings to try and testify. Instead, a group that might be able to work behind the scenes (before these bills are scheduled for a hearing) with groups such as the NRA and Oregon Firearms Federation who are fighting for our rights. As a club, we have over 1,400 members who should have a strong voice in our state and region. We sat and watched as the local lawmakers and prominent people testified how much this law would make all our lives safer and how us "law abiding citizens

were at fault, because we took our legally purchased firearms to Portland and sold them to gang bangers on the street." The shootings and street crimes in Portland were our fault! They didn't want to hear about the less than one percent of gun buys that were stopped by the laws already on the books and the dirty little secret that those attempting to make those purchases illegally were not prosecuted.
