Time for my bi-yearly whine about range damage. It is getting worse and more expensive. In the past we have had to replace the Indoor target carriers & 2X4s and patch the baffles once every three or four months. Now it is monthly if not weekly. Also there is some damage that can only be described as wanton.


The 100 Yard Range target carriers were completely replaced at the end of April. They need to be replaced again now (late September). Many of the steel brackets were new in April; as the photos show they have become targets and we apparently do have some members that can shoot pretty good groups but their choice of targets is costing you money. It appears that they are posting targets on the posts and the 2X4 stringers rather than the plastic target carriers.

We have gotten a few holes in the new 1000 target number boards and bunches in the 600 yard target number boards. Some are probably rifle shooters whose dope if off but some are apparently done on purpose. A few are even pistol bullet holes.

We have also found damage to the steel silhouettes at the Silhouette Range caused by shooting high-powered center-fire rifles, which is against the SOPs.

Please don't shoot at unauthorized targets. Please watch what others are doing on the range and confront them or at least report them if they are causing damage. This is **YOUR RANGE** and the increasing damage is **COSTING YOU MONEY.**

Deer and Elk

Deer and elk hunting across Oregon is expected to be fair this season. Buck and bull ratios are improved in many wildlife management units.

Nevertheless, overall declines in populations due to habitat changes, predation and disease mean hunters may need to expand on longheld behaviors to be successful. For example, hunters should look beyond disturbances to find deer and elk, especially on the eastside which has experienced several years of drought. In dry conditions, animals will be looking for cover, cool and water--hunters should too. Additionally, hunters should expect to walk in to hunting areas, not drive, to be successful.

Westside hunters also should look beyond clear-cuts and old fires when hunting deer and elk. Rather, look for areas with a mixture of different age cuts to increase the number of animals you are likely

to find. Pre-season scouting is even more important in these conditions. Westside hunters should be aware that biologists are seeing more deer and elk moving away from national forestland and onto private timber and agricultural land, as reduced forest management on national forestland means more deer and elk looking for forage on areas with logging operations. Thanks to ODFW's Access and Habitat program and the cooperation of private forestland owners, hunters can access much private forestland during deer and elk season; see hunting locations and by-unit reports for more information.

Relief in Sight?

The Gun Control Act of 1968 imposed a lifetime ban on firearm possession by any person who was ever adjudicated as a mental defective or committed to a mental institution. The Firearms Owners' Protection Act of 1986 provided that such persons could petition BATFE for removal of such disabilities, but Congress has prohibited that procedure in annual appropriations acts. For the first time since 1968, the "NICS Improvement Amendments Act of 2007," H.R. 2640, would allow the states to provide procedures to remove these federal disabilities, and also require federal agencies to adopt disability removal procedures.

Imposing a lifetime firearm ban on all persons who were ever subject to such adjudications or commitments, without any hope for such persons to prove themselves recovered, is cruel and vindictive. H.R. 2640 would remedy this injustice and allow restoration of such persons' Second Amendment rights.

Almost all mental commitments and adjudications occur under state law. This bill requires states to have procedures to allow such persons to show that they would not be a danger to public safety. Under H.R. 2640, the State "shall grant the relief" if the person is unlikely to endanger the public. The person would also have the right to appeal a denial

to a state court. This is the first time since the ban was imposed in 1968 that persons could seek relief at the state level, thereby reforming current law which only authorizes BATFE to decide on relief. When BATFE used to administer such a program, it granted relief about 40% of the time, but Congress has circumvented that law by defunding the BATFE program.

The Veterans' Administration and other federal agencies also conduct certain adjudications and commitments, and the bill provides for removal of these disabilities by these same agencies—rather than by BATFE—and for judicial review of any denial. Many people could also get relief from a provision in the bill that excludes adjudications or commitments where the person has been "fully released or discharged from all mandatory treatment, supervision, or monitoring."

Passage of H.R. 2640 would, for the first time in their lives, give hope to persons who in the past were subject to a mental commitment or adjudication and have recovered their mental health. Current law only serves to sentence such persons to a lifetime ban on firearms without any chance of ever redeeming their Second Amendment rights.

Civilian Markmanship Program

The next batch of M1 Carbines won't be available for ordering until January '08. Those will be Winchesters. Quality Hardware mfg. in April, Standard Products mfg. in July, National Postal Meter mfg. in August, IBM mfg. in October, Saginaw SG mfg. in January and March '09, and Rockola in April.

A large transfer of M1 Garands was received in August of this year from the U.S. Army. Orders are now being accepted for both M1 Garand (field and service grades) and M1D Garand, Sniper (field and rack grades).

U.S. Model 1903 & 1903A3's are sold out. Any that are received will be offered for sale in January, 2009.

M1917 Enfield Rifles are also sold out. Any that appear will be offered sometime in 2008.


