
- 1 All 12 gauge ammo will be only Club ammo that will be sold at the shotgun club house. It looks like the ammo price will be \$5.50 per box.
- 2 The shooting stations and the machines will be restricted.
- 3 Members will no longer be able to shoot on their own without a shotgun range master on site.
- 4 The new SOP will be posted and handed out to all shooters upon the first time out.
- 5 There will be a new schedule for each shotgun discipline.
- 6 No reloads will be allowed.

We will post on line the date of our grand opening, so keep your eyes open and blow the dust off your shotgun and oil it; we are close to resuming our program.

I would like to thank everyone that has worked on the project with special note of the fabulous 4 (Ron Carey, Mike Holder, Bill Trousdale, Norm Allen).

I would like to beg for more help for Ron as he has more projects that need help to complete.

ODFW Finalizing Grant for Archery Range

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife is finalizing the approval of DRRC's application for funding of Archery Range improvements. The funds are administered by ODFW and come via the Federal Aid in Wildlife Restoration Act, aka Pittman-Robertson. The funds are collected as excise taxes on sporting goods purchases, and are granted by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The USFWS has already approved the DRRC application. The grant is a matching funds grant, with 50% of our project cost to be covered by the federal funds.

Once the final approval of our application is in hand, Project Director Ron Carey will begin work on a new structure to cover the archery firing line and give archers a dry place to practice all year around. Ron will be looking for carpenters and others to help with the construction of the new improvements, so contact him to give him your name and availability if you are interested in helping out.
