# International Distinguished Badges

The National Rifle Association has created a badge to recognize achievement and to encourage U.S. shooters to get involved in international shooting events. The NRA International Distinguished Badge (IDB) is available to Target Rifle and F-Class shooters and coaches. It is similar to the Civilian Marksmanship Program which recognizes Olympic shooters.

Points are earned by competing in International Confederation of Fullbore Rifle Association sanctioned matches. A total of 30 points must be earned in individual and team events. The initial set of International Distinguished Badges for F-Class shooters were awarded at the 2016 U.S. Long Range Championship in Lodi, WI in September.

Congratulations to Stan Pate and John Weil, who both earned their IDB in the F-T/R classification. Many of us know Stan as our Past President, Board Member and of course a remarkable long range shooter. We may remember in 2009 when Stan won the overall Bronze medal in the World Championships. He earned his points for the IDB at that match in the individual and team events.

John Weil is a past Treasurer of DRRC, and another outstanding long range shooter. John competed in the 2009 and 2013 World Championships and earned his points for the IDB in the team competitions at those events.

Both these men represent our Club with distinction nationally and internationally, and their International Distinguished Badges confirm that. They are a large part of why we boast to be the Home of World and National Champions.

# Adult Smallbore Starts in November

Winter is coming. No, this isn't a warning about battles and betrayals, it is a reminder that with the change in season, our Adult Smallbore program starts up again at DRRC. November marks the beginning of practice sessions and organizing for the next season of Columbia Willamette Rifle League competitions.

Bob Stevens and Glen Miller brought Adult Smallbore back to DRRC in 2010, and since then they have been very successful in recruiting shooters and fielding strong teams. Their success is reflected in four consecutive league championships. This month, they'll start gearing up to win "one for the thumb."

Adult Smallbore competitions in the CWRL are shot at 50 feet, using .22 caliber rifles. The rifles are typically match style. The course of fire is 40 shots; 10 shots prone, 10 shots sitting, 10 shots kneeling and 10 shots standing. Shooters are allowed to shoot a more difficult position if, for example, they are unable to get into a prone or sitting position. Sights can be either a scope or open sights. Ammunition

is typically 40gr standard velocity lead round nose. Other equipment used often includes a spotting scope, shooting glove, mat, sling, kneeling roll and shooting coat. Beginners are often able to improvise or to borrow much of the equipment to get started in the sport.

Practice sessions occur the first three Friday evenings in November. Competitions are held weekly on Friday evenings in December through early April. The teams represent various gun clubs in the area, such as Vancouver Rifle and Pistol Club, Portland Rifle and Pistol Club, and Tri-County Gun Club. Matches are either home or away. For home matches, the other team will come to DRRC, and DRRC will travel to the other club for away matches. Camaraderie, good sportsmanship, and social outings after matches are hallmarks of the CWRL matches.

### **MOH Dahl Memorial**

On November 9, 1 PM, at the Red Soils Complex in Oregon City, 2051 Kaen Road, the Larry G. Dahl Memorial will have a rededication ceremony.

Sp4c Dahl, born in Oregon City, was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor for his sacrifice in Vietnam. He was killed in action on Feb. 23, 1971, sacrificing his life by throwing his body upon a grenade that had been lobbed into the gun truck he was riding in. His action saved the lives of other members of his company.

The memorial was previously located on the grounds of the Museum of the Oregon Territory, Oregon City. The new site for the

memorial is at the Circle of Honor, which commemorates the actions and sacrifices of local veterans and their families.

The rededication ceremony will feature guest speakers from the military including the Adjutant General of Oregon, Major General Michael E. Stencel; Brigadier General Steven Beach; and Major General Thomas Mattson, now retired, who was a Platoon Leader in the 6th Battalion, 71st Artillery unit in Vietnam.

The ceremony will also feature the presentation of the Bronze Eagle Award to Dahl's family. Larry Dahl's son, SgtFC Michael Dahl, will speak at the event.
