

## Dog Days

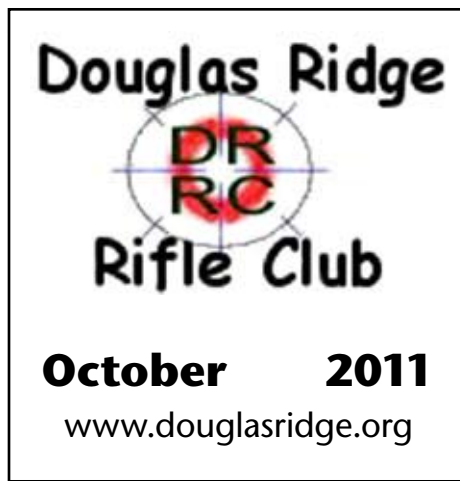

This is your chance and it is never too soon to mark you calendar. December 9th and 10th is our next CMP class and match. This is a great match for beginners to try CMP as it is all shot under cover from the 100 yard line and is the easiest match to learn for all you wanna be CMP shooters. Friday the 9th is the mandatory class for all first time CMP shooters or those that just want to a refresher. You will learn how to handle the M1 Garand rifle, safety procedures, how to score, all about the match and more. Class time is from 6 PM – 9:30 PM and you need to sign up in advance for the class. Class size is limited to be sure to sign up right away.



Saturday the 10th is match time. Show up at 8 AM to help load equipment and set up the line. All CMP shooters help set up and tear down the line and stow the gear. 9 AM shooting starts. 100 yard matches tend to be popular so they usually have 3 relays and most shooting is typically done by 1 PM with final score summary sheets and certificates provided to those that hang around for a bit after the match. Kibitzing about how you did or did not do is also a favorite pastime while waiting for scores and certificates.

We consider these fun matches that are geared towards new shooters and having a good time. It is not about winning but about doing the best you can and having a good time, though winning does earn you bragging rights until the next match. You can't beat the price either. For new shooters \$40 gets you the class, match fee, use of a club M1 Garand (limited number available), ammo, targets and match fee. ## Survey Results

Survey Results – As many of you know a member survey was completed by the planning group during the month of July. The survey was administered through the website using a free survey service. Slightly over 370 members responded; that's appreciated. So, what did we find out? The survey asked about three general areas; membership; use of facilities; and participation in club shooting disciplines. Lack of shotgun disciplines skews the results somewhat. However, here's what the average of the DRRC responses tells us.

### Membership

- Most (55%) have been a member 1 – 8 years . (12 members 30 years or more).
- Most found out about DRRC from a friend (38%); or the sign out front (20%)
- Most don't shoot often; 30 % 1-3 times a month; 36% less than once a month.
- So new members most often come because of a friend or the sign out front. What you tell your friends about DRRC is important and does make a difference.

### Use of Facilities

- Range(s) used most often: 100-200 yard 47%; Indoor 21%, Silhouette 16%.
- Which days used – all over the map, and depending on work schedules.
- Ranges are used most often during the days 74%.
- Does this mean that most members are retired? Should

**Participation in Shooting Disciplines**

- Do you like to participate in shooting disciplines? YES 68%
- More popular disciplines – no clear winner particularly without shotgun.
- Popular disciplines – CMP, High Power, Trap, Sporting Clays.
- Other disciplines – wide spread of choices.

**Member support of Disciplines and Club Activities**

- Willing to be a Discipline Director – NO 78%
- Willing to pay more dues / fees to fund improvements NO 57%, YES 42%
- Does DRCC offer enough classroom instruction YES 70%
- Should DRRC add classroom facilities? The results split three ways: Yes, No, maybe
- Costs to add classroom space – NO 55%, YES, or Maybe 45%
- Classes taught at DRRC - OK to offer and to rent to outside classes ? Yes, 85%
- Non members should pay more for classes? Results spread but YES 27%
- Cost of dues reasonable – YES 66%, Neutral 25%, NO 8%
- Support for annual open house YES 75% Willing to help 70%
- Board of Directors performance – Good, and Very Good, 80%
- Newsletter read? Yes 74% Newsletter helpful Yes 55%, Sometimes 42%

In addition members were able to add specific comments or concerns; many expressed the need for shotgun activities to be restarted. That is being addressed by the DRRC Board.

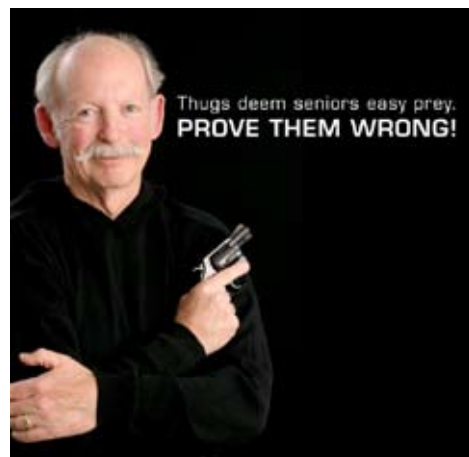

## SOP: Procedures to Deal with Unwanted People on The Range

When encountering a person on The Range who is exhibiting dangerous or offensive behavior or who has previously been expelled from The Range with reason, any member may request of that person to leave the premises. Should that person refuse the request the requestor may call Clackamas County Sheriff dispatch (503/655-8911) or 911 and state that there is an trespasser (with a firearm, if applicable) and ask for a law enforcement officer to be dispatched to deal with the problem. A Club member should be sent to the front gate to admit the officer and escort him to the site of the infraction.

The Range Host should be notified immediately.

Meanwhile collect information as to the person's identity; name, member number, automobile ID and ID of other people with the offender.

A verbal and a written report of the incident, including all pertinent details and witness information should be submitted to any Board member as soon as possible. This may be done by phone call or by electronic communication.

The Board shall deal with the issue as soon as possible and make appropriate decisions as to the further action deemed necessary to dispose of the situation. A communication (U.S. Mail) should be sent to the offender describing the offense and the decision of the Board as to the disposition of the situation. A copy should be sent to any external organization involved with the original situation (e.g. the police agency originally called).
