

hunting, fishing and trapping laws. If a person's license or permit privileges which come under the scope of the Compact are suspended or revoked in one member state, they are subject to suspension or revocation in all member states. In addition to license and permit suspensions and revocations which result from a conviction for the illegal pursuit, possession or taking of mammals, birds, fish, reptiles, amphibians, mollusks, shellfish and crustaceans, failing to appear in court or to otherwise answer a ticket or summons issued for such violations will also result in license or permit suspension. Compact member states also agree to recognize convictions for violations within the scope of the Compact which occur in all other member states and to apply them toward license and permit suspension and revocations in the state in which the person resides.

# Marijuana Grows on the Increase

With the increase of unlawful marijuana grows being located on State and National land, hunters should be aware of their surroundings while recreating.

If you observe camp sites away from main roads, irrigation equipment, cultivated areas or marijuana plants, leave the area immediately from the same direction you entered. Note the location of the suspicious activities and report that information to your local law enforcement agency or the Oregon State Police TIP line, 1-800/472-7888.



## Hunter Orange ODFW website

Hunters age 17 and under *must* wear a hunter orange exterior garment (shirt, jacket, coat, vest, or sweater) or hat when hunting game mammals or upland birds (except turkey) with any firearm. The exterior garment or hat must have hunter orange visible in all directions (360 degrees).

# Oregon is Black Bear Country

Follow these guidelines to avoid conflicts:

- Keep food in bear-proof containers or store in trunk vehicle.
- Be aware of your surroundings at all times.
- Know that by calling in an animal, you may attract bear.
- Carry bear spray and know how to use it.
- Watch for fresh bear signs such as tracks, droppings or diggings.
- Be careful when field-dressing a deer or elk. Make noise; talk and laugh so bears know you are there.
- If you have to leave the carcass overnight, hang it at least 10-12 feet off the ground and 5-6 feet from nearby trees in an open area.
