# New Gate System Operational!

Our new gate system is operation and it is really nice. Just imagine, on a cold rainy day when you come out to shoot you won't have to get out of your car to open or close the gate. Now for some questions and answers regarding the new gate system.

Q. Do I need a new code to get in?

- A. Yes and No. Eventually you will be getting a new access card that when read by the scanner will automatically open the gate. Until you get your new access card the existing access codes will continue to work.
- Q. Where do I enter the current access code?
- A. As you drive up to the gate simply pull close enough to the keypad to reach through your window and enter the code. The gate will automatically open in just a few seconds. The gate will then automatically close after you enter.
- Q. Must I enter a code or use my card to exit?
- A. No. Just pull up to the stop line and a ground sensor loop will detect the presence of your vehicle and the gate will automatically open and then close after you leave.
- Q. If I stop my vehicle in the gate entrance will the gate close on my vehicle?
- A. No. There is an electric eye at the gate that will prevent the gate from closing while you are going through the gate or if you must stop before getting all the way through.
- Q. How does the card work?
- A. These are called proximity cards. When you stop at the scanner you will need to slowly wave your card within 2-4 inches of the keypad and when you hear a beep, the card has been read and the gate will open.
- **Q.** Is there a fee for the new access cards?
- A. Yes, there is a fully refundable mandatory \$5 deposit for your card. When the card is returned in good operational condition the \$5 will be refunded.
- Q. If I damage or loose my card can I get another one and is there a cost?
- A. Yes, you can get a new card for lost or damaged cards. There will be another \$5 deposit required for that card and the original deposit will not be refunded.

Any subsequent lost or damaged cards may be replaced for a \$15 nonrefundable fee. The lost or damaged card will be deactivated and will not work in the system once a replacement card is provided.

- Q. If I don't want an access card can I continue to enter using the access code via the keypad?
- **A.** No. The cutoff date for getting your new access card is September 30. After that date members must use the access card to enter.
- Q. How do I get my access card?
- A. There are two ways to get your access card. We will mail your card to you if you send us a check for \$7 (\$5 refundable deposit + \$2 non refundable shipping and handling charge) to DRRC Access Card, PO Box 1448, Boring OR 97009. Or you can personally pick up your access card at the clubhouse on one of the following dates and times. Sept 2<sup>nd</sup> at the General Meeting. Sept 10, 11, 12 from 4 pm until 8 pm. Sept 17, 18, 19, from 4 pm until 8 pm. September 24, 25, 26 from 4 pm until 8 pm.
- **Q.** Will I have to continue signing in at the main entrance sign in center?
- A. No. Club members will no longer need to sign in once they have their access card. The system is programmed to recognize your assigned card and will log you in when you scan your card.
- **Q.** Will associate and junior members get access cards?
- A. No. As with the old access code system only senior members will get access cards. Associate and junior members will need to continue to enter the premises with a senior member, except for public events, classes and matches.
- **Q.** Will associates, juniors, and guests have to continue to sign in?
- A. Yes and No. Associates and juniors will not have to sign in at the gate but will sign in at the range being used. Guests will continue to sign in at the front gate and pay the \$5 guest fee.
- Q. How will non-members get in to participate in public matches and events?
- A. For some events such as the Hunter's Sight-In, the gate will be programmed to stay open during a specific time frame. For other events such as matches, each match will have a special code just for those matches and non-member participants will need that code to access the event on that date. These special codes will not change from date to date.

The system will be programmed to allow access via those codes on specific dates only. Discipline Directors will have to make an extra effort to provide those special codes to nonmembers who want to shoot at their matches.

Q. What happens if the system fails? Will I still be able to access the range?

A. In the unlikely event that the system fails for reasons including power outage, our range host knows how to disable the gate system to allow manual access to the range.

cont. from front page involved in the DRRC highpower service rifle program. Tom spent each winter handloading thousands of .223, 308 and 30-06 rounds, much of it at his own expense, to make the event possible each September. Many of the firearms used at the clanger were also purchased and supplied by Tom. The 200-yard clanger fund-raiser was something Tom felt strongly about and his dedication and energy was felt by all that assisted him in this program. One of Tom's standing rules was that all women and kids could always shoot for free. The clanger was more than just a fund-raiser to many shooters who took part. It became a place where many adults could relive their military past and once again shoot an M1 Garand, M1 Carbine, M14 or AR 15 service rifle. It was also a place where shooters, young and old alike, could experience for the first time the thrill of shooting a center fire service rifle and hearing the resounding sound of a solid hit on the distant clanger. Tom and his clanger event will be missed. Perhaps sometime in the future such an event will once again be a part of DRRC Sight-In days.

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
