President's Report


Stan Pate, DRRC President

DRRC has been a very busy place during August. If you shoot regularly on the range you'll know what I mean, Between the different matches, the work that's been going on to improve the range, and the appearance of the range things are developing well. Many of you will notice that the upper pits have been completed and are looking very good. Much of the work has been done to clean up the area in the trees next to the road way that heads down range, soon we will drag the dirt to finish smoothing it and plant some grass this fall.

The 1st annual Pacific Northwest International F-Class Championship is now in the record books, and was a great success. We had teams from Ireland, Scotland, Canada, members of the U.S. team, as well as a factory team. Present were both Scottish F-Class teams, one of the Irish F-Class teams, Jim Murphy from the U.S. Open F-Class team who formed a team for the match, and Team Savage that is comprised of Darrell Buell, John Weil, Stan Pate; DRRC members, and the fourth member is Monte Milanuk from Eastern Washington. We are awaiting confirmation of possible national records from this match.

The match was NRA sanctioned as well as the second half of a match that started in British Columbia the week before. The combination of these two matches formed a "Super Aggregate" that is a combination of the two aggregate scores of individual shooters scores of both matches. As far as the committee knows this is the only place in the world that collaboration like this happens between two different countries, and their respective shooting associations.

In both countries the DRRC based F/TR team won the team matches for an award of gold bullion badges. At DRRC the "local team" took almost all of the individual awards with the remainder going to members of visiting teams. John Weil won the super aggregate 1st place award, Darrell Buell took second, and Monte Milanuk



took the third place award. In the individual aggregate Darrell Buell took the brand new Savage Arms trophy for 1st place, John Weil was second, and Stan Pate was third. The medal count is too large to go into detail on in a newsletter.

In the F-Open class Jim Murphy from the U.S. team took top honors for the Super Aggregate score as well as winning the brand new Sportsman's Warehouse trophy for 1st place for the individual F-Open Class, his shooting was inspiring to watch. Second place individual went to Dennis Groom from Scotland, 3rd went to Mike Downey from Texas. In the Super aggregate, second place was Liam Fenlon from Ireland, and third was Paul Sandie from Scotland.

DRRC was complimented many times by most of the competitors from the U.S. and all visiting teams. Everyone seemed ready and willing to start planning on returning to our club for future matches. The Scots and Irish have started making plans for a return trip in 2010 to attend these matches.

On a less positive note, the brand new number boards in the upper impact area are already being shot up by someone or persons who seem to have no problem with destroying club property. While inspecting the upper pits we discovered "many" hand gun caliber bullets stuck in the number boards or lying on the ground on top of the impact area. Discovered also were several rifle caliber holes that were shot into these same number boards, many of these holes were discovered before the upper pits had even been used

for a long range practice day. Most of these shots appear to be coming from the covered 100/200 firing points and do not appear to be accidents. If you should see anyone shooting at these number boards you are encouraged to let someone know, as this is willfully destroying club property and is costing the club a great deal of time and money. These brand new number boards will need to be repaired before the rains start or they will be damaged.

As usual I look forward to seeing you on the range and would greatly appreciate your suggestions and comments about the club. I also look forward to seeing you at any coming meetings that you might be able to attend.


