
President's Report

As I write this, it seems we just started the new Club year. But it is already time to think about meeting the work hour requirements for the year. Hunter Sight-In launches this month, and for many members it is almost the last chance to get their work hours completed easily. Once the fall season arrives, and the days grow shorter, wetter and colder, getting work hours at the

Club becomes harder to do. At this time, a Fall Work Day is not scheduled. And the Annual Work Day in 2017 occurs on a holiday weekend, which may hinder some members from participating. So working at a Hunter Sight-In day might be the last best chance for weekend work, especially for those members whose schedules don't allow for the Tuesday morning work parties.

A quick review: if you joined the club before July 1, 2016, and you are a Senior member, you need to complete 8 or more hours of work to support the Club, or you will be charged a \$150 Work Assessment Fee at the 2017 renewal. The work must be completed by Saturday April 15th, 2017. Senior members are all members who have not achieved Oldtime or Life member status. Associate and Junior members do not have a work requirement, but any work they do counts towards the Senior member's total.

On-line sign-up for helping at Hunter Sight-In have been open for a month. The on-line sign-ups help ensure we have the basic requirements met to run the events. But even if the days are filled and you can't sign up, come out to help anyway. The HSI leadership team will find a way to put you to work.

If you can't make Hunter Sightin, contact Project Coordinator Ron Carey to see what other opportunities are available where you can contribute. There's always something that needs to be done at the Club.

Club Projects Update

Ron and his crew of volunteer helpers built a great structure that should provide many years of service for the archers at DRRC.

The Archery Range cover was funded by a Pittman-Robertson grant approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, which provided 50% of the cost of the project. DRRC has a history of working with the ODFW to obtain grants to improve our facilities and provide a better recreational experience to our members, guests and the public who use our facilities.

Ron reported that other projects in the works include the relocation of the tower for the Shotgun Range, and installing pavement in the parking area for the Shotgun Range.

For the weekend of July 14th through the 17th, The Barlow Trail Long Rifles organized a Rendezvous very near the Timberline.

The rendezvous was geared to show what the Mountain Men did and the skills they had up until about 1840. There was one area for primitive camping that only allowed things and shelters available to the Mountain Men. The folks there were in full costume, and used only the items that were true for the period.

Another area was for people who wanted to use their travel

trailers and motor homes for the four days.

Aside for the activities and demonstrations, there were many shooting events for black powder muzzle loader, primitive archery, tomahawk and knife throwing, flint and steel fire making and trap setting.

I saw children making leather goods, under supervision; children who asked me for a round ball for the scavenger hunt; a candy cannon that shot candy up into the sky; blacksmithing lessons and a host of other family activities. There were Mountain Men (and women) in buckskin and pretty women in those long dresses of yesteryear.

The muzzle loading group from DRRC was well represented and led by Don Edwards; who I found was living is a teepee.

The shoot that I participated in was a trail shoot through the forest on a winding pleasant trail with many different targets spaced along in the woods. There were very challenging targets like; cutting a card in half, shooting potatoes, charcoal briquettes on strings, metal swinging targets, as well as hawk throwing, trap setting, and an extra point for a timed flint and steel fire starting.

Don Edwards won first place and was awarded a decorated plate and a highly decorated sash that he has to give up next year for the new winner. I hope he wears it always until then.

This event is one that you and your family should visit every year in July. It's historical, educational, and all with a pleasant group of kind and helpful people.

Keep in mind the black powder shoot once a month at DRRC. It's one of the most relaxing mornings that you can spend. Bring a can of chili for the pot.
